- 1.4. Motion approve the minutes of the April 9, 2020 Executive Meeting (<u>link</u>) (moved by Peter, seconded by Alan approved) (7:56PM)
- 1.5. Report from Jody Langois
 - 1.5.1. Tomorrow is Indigeneous Focus Day -- previously planned for a full gather of staff, will now be presented via recorded content. Andrea Maynard will be the keynote speaker. Looking for participants to help identify gaps to close.
 - 1.5.1.1. Question re: shared videos any ability for parents to access. (Jody will find out, would like to)
 - 1.5.2. Summer school format will change to online. Scope of offerings and target audience has been narrowed, focus on graduation. Students outside of VSB still can access VLN.

- 1.5.3. Some students are already attending schools, some childcare (essential service workers) and students with special needs (lifeskills classes at Tupper), only four students out of 25 available seats. Will continue to roll out over the next week, more elementary students next week. Staff had a chance to see the setting prior to starting
 - 1.5.3.1. Question re: essential worker childcare is that existing providers, or VSB staff? (Answer: VSB staff, mandated to provide free to essential worker staff. Now at two sites, not three sites as previously. 136 students between two sites)
 Followup question - re: how does this feed into the idea of VSB obtaining childcare license. (Answer: Not related, this is considered "in school support" by province in this situation.)
 Are they getting instruction and what are the age ranges? (Answer:5 to 12, per mandate from ministry; staff are supporting and facilitating work on what has been provided by their teacher)
- 1.5.4. Food security lots happening; notable response, Freshroots feeding 300 families (600 meals) twice a week; space donated by Italian Cultural Center; also some volunteers with deliveries. Chefs and kitchens that have been sidelined also stepping up. Other initiatives too, Backpack Buddies, etc. This is also in addition to ongoing VSB programs.
- 1.5.5. Other initiatives Telus bringing WiFi to families, tech being distributed by school district, school PACs bringing gift cards to vulnerable families.

Will playgrounds be opened at end of month? (Looking at it, trying to work in lockstep with Vancouver Parks and advice from PHO.)
